
## Vision 2025 - A Year of Transformation and New Beginnings

We kicked off 2025 with clarity and conviction. Vision 2025 isn't just a theme—it's our declaration of alignment, innovation, and impact. We entered the year focused on building power, deepening trust, and shaping a future rooted in reproductive and sexual justice. From internal restructuring to bold campaign planning, January laid the groundwork for a year that centers truth-telling, storytelling, and movement-building. This month marked the start of our renewed commitment to show up louder, smarter, and more strategically for the communities we serve—especially Black women, queer folks, and people living with HIV.



Black Folks Day on the Hill + YouMeHIV | National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day

In February, we mobilized across policy and public health spaces to affirm that Black lives and Black health matter. At Black Folks Day on the Hill (IBFDOH), our team joined a coalition of advocates in Nashville to demand equity, dignity, and justice in Tennessee policy. Back home, our YouMeHIV campaign amplified the lived realities of Black people living with HIV through education, storytelling, and celebration. In honor of National Black HIV & AIDS Awareness Day, we centered truth, care, and community—showing that when we lead with lived experience, we change the narrative, the system and the outcomes



### **Women's History Month**

In celebration of Women's History Month, we hosted Cheers to HER—a vibrant event honoring six remarkable women shaping the Mid-South through education, advocacy, technology, and justice. Each honoree received a signature cocktail (or mocktail) named in her honor, symbolizing the unique brilliance she brings to our community.

Cheers to HER was a space for storytelling, connection, and recognition. It deepened our community partnerships and affirmed our commitment to honoring ALL women—not only for what they survive but for how they lead.









#### **Black Maternal Health Week**

During Black Maternal Health Week, we amplified the urgency of protecting Black birthing people. Through powerful visuals, reels, and conversations, we addressed medical racism, systemic neglect, and the rising rates of maternal mortality among Black women in Tennessee and beyond. We lifted doulas, birth workers and birthing people who are demanding more than survival – they are demanding justice. Our programming helped frame the health of birthing people as a core pillar of reproductive and sexual justice and reminded our community that every Black birth story deserves to be safe, sacred, and supported.



Black Folks Day on the Hill + YouMeHIV | National Black HIV/AIDS Awareness Day

In May, culture met cause as the Mid-South Music Festival (MSMF) brought the city together for a night of rhythm, resistance, and reproductive justice. Eric Roberson headlined a powerful experience that wasn't just a concert; it was a moment. We fused music, advocacy, and joy to center Black expression as a vehicle for health, healing and visibility. This inaugural event marked a new chapter in how SisterReach reaches people—meeting them in celebration while seeding powerful messages about equity, bodily autonomy, and community care. MSMF is more than a vibe, it's a vision in motion.



#### Halfway There. All In.

From bold policy advocacy to joyful resistance, from the TN State Capitol to the concert stage—this first half of 2025 has been proof that SisterReach shows up with strategy, spirit, and deep community care. But the work is far from over.
